This contract addendum is made and entered into on the date signed by and between the City of Greensboro, a municipal corporation of the State of North Carolina (herein referred to as the CITY) and New Earth Designs, Inc., herein referred to as New Earth Designs, Inc., a corporation, with offices located as written above.

WITNESSETH:

The City's **Planning Department** has consulted with the College Hill Neighborhood Association, who supports the City's recommendation to enter into a renewal agreement with the **Planning Department** and **New Earth Designs, Inc.,** in consideration of the foregoing, the mutual covenants contained in this Agreement, and other good and valuable consideration, the parties agree to renew maintenance and street tree program services specified in the original agreement and subsequent addendums as follows:

Contract Renewal Addendum

1) Scope of Work

In consideration of the monetary payment hereinafter described, **New Earth Designs**, **Inc.** will provide ongoing Maintenance of Landscaping and Management of the Street Tree Program in the College Hill Historic District. Such services shall be performed and charged for in accordance with the attached Exhibit C, New Earth Design's Fee Schedule from the original agreement and attached Exhibit D, New Earth Design's Fee Schedule for the amended scope of work, including maintenance for landscaping improvements in the West McGee Street Planting at Greensboro College Soccer Field.

2) Term

In accordance with the original agreement, the terms of this renewal agreement shall be from the effective date of October 1, 2013 through September 30, 2014.

3) Compensation

City agrees to compensate **New Earth Design's Inc.** a total annual contract value not to exceed \$18,675.00. This increase in compensation shall be billed and paid for in accordance with Exhibits C and D, Fee Schedules, incorporated herein.

4) Insurance Requirements

The following insurance requirements replace the insurance requirements in the original agreement:

Commercial Liability Insurance Requirements

New Earth Designs shall maintain minimum limits of \$1,000,000 per occurrence combined single limit for bodily injury liability and property damage liability, with a \$2,000,000 aggregate limit. This shall include premises and/or operations, independent contractors, products and/or completed operations, broad form property damage and explosion, collapse and underground damage coverage, sudden and accidental pollution losses, and a contractual liability endorsement.

Special Requirements

The City of Greensboro is to be named as additional insured on the Commercial General Liability policy. Current, valid insurance policies meeting the above requirements shall be maintained for the duration of the project. Renewed policies under this contract shall be sent thirty (30) days prior to any expiration date to:

Policies of Insurance on an Acord 25 (8/84) or similar for meeting the required insurance provisions shall be forwarded to the City of Greensboro Centralized Contracting Division. Wording on the Policy of Insurance which states that no liability shall be imposed upon the company for failure to provide such notice is not acceptable. Original policies or certified copies of policies may be required by the City at any time.

Contractor shall not assign any part of this contract to other contractors or subcontractors without written pre-approval of the City; in which case, it shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to insure that all subcontractors comply with the same insurance requirements that Contractor is required to meet.

The City shall be named as an additional insured on the Contractor_s general liability insurance policy, which shall be primary and not contributory to any other insurance that may be available to the City. The Contractor will also secure its general liability insurance from an A rated insurance company acceptable to the City. The Contractor will provide a Certificate of Liability statement that states, _City of Greensboro is added as an additional insured as evidenced by the endorsement attached to this certificate. The Contractor will also provide a copy of the additional insured endorsement to

	the City upon the request for execution of this Agreement. In the event the Contractor fails to maintain and keep in force for the duration of this Contract the insurance required herein, the City may cancel and terminate this contract without notice.
5)	All other provisions of the original agreement shall remain in effect.
