Sam Nunn Professor of Law at Emory University School of Law Founding Director of the Center for the Study of Law and Religion Co-founder and senior advisor of the Center for Community Progress (www.communityprogress.net), an organization that helps US communities integrate vacant, abandoned, and blighted properties back into their economic and civic life.

As founder of Emory University's Law and Religion Program in 1982, Professor Alexander's work in recent years has focused on community development and

He received his JD from Harvard University, his Masters in Theological Studies at Harvard Divinity School and his BA from the University of North Carolina. He resides in Atlanta.
